As the weather warms up, please remember to protect your students when riding bikes, swimming and during sports. Students should wear clothing to protect against sunburns, and use sunscreen.

Hats on hot days to guard against dehydration. Increased water intake instead of juice and sodas will help your body replace what is being released as sweat. Frozen or cold fruit and smoothies will help cool you off and replace vitamins and minerals to your body.

Remember to use helmets when doing sports, riding bikes, skateboards and other activities to guard against concussions. When swimming, use life jackets if your children cannot swim, and please do not leave them unattended.

Student Support:

We are finishing up the Parenting with Love and Logic classes over the next 2 weeks and it has been a very good experience. I look forward to doing more classes in the fall.

One thing we talked about in the last class was giving our children the chance to try to solve their own problems, unless safety is a consideration. You give them a few suggestion that they might try if they want some help, but leave the ultimate solution up to them.
